Alexander, King of Jesters, will perform his unusual comedy at _____ on _____ at _____ PM.

This offbeat performance includes Renaissance water spouting, the nose flute serenade, jingle bell juggling, twisted sticks of the forest, balancing stunts high above the audience, and other unusual routines inspired by the rich tradition of the fool.

The performance begins with a mysterious monk dutifully writing with his quill, looking around as he persists in his tiresome task. In the blink of an eye, he whips off his robe and revels in the merry world of the crazy court jester.

A real jester is a poet in motion, using a dancer's grace, the acrobat's bravado and the comedian's mastery of the funny bone. Alexander is known for his arresting visual gags and stunts. In one routine, he peers at the audience through a darting eyeball in his mouth shortly before cramming three flutes past his rubbery lips. Without missing a beat, he plays a sweet tune in staggered rhythms on all three at once as an astonished audience claps along.

Alexander speaks a magical sounding gibberish language called Grammelot that originated in Europe centuries ago. In those times nearly every village had its own dialect, sometimes even a completely different language. Grammelot helped traveling jesters and minstrels cut through language barriers that presented themselves every few miles. It serves Alexander today since he often performs abroad.

He was introduced on the Good Day Show as, "One of the best one-man acts that we've ever seen. He's had our studio in stitches!". Boston Magazine says that "He can make the stiffest of stiffs laugh". Alexander has thrilled audiences at theaters throughout the U.S., and has been featured at The Just for Laughs International Comedy Festival in Montreal, Showtime comedy spectacular and arts and performance festivals in Australia, Belgium, Bermuda, France, Japan, Singapore and New Zealand.
